News from Chapter Members

During Lent **Bernard Sanders** will once again perform his own "Stations of the Cross" for organ solo in concerts in Trossingen (March 17th)and on Palm Sunday (March 24th) in the Abbey Church of Beuron (Baden Wuerttemberg, Germany). The cycle is a musical depiction of the 14 stations in a series of 7 Preludes and Fugues. Parallel to the music, pictures of the stained glass windows in the church of Mary Queen, Tuttlingen, designed by Wilhelm Geyer, will be projected onto a screen in the front of the church. After his premier performance in 2021 Reiner Schulte recorded the entire cycle on the Kreisz organ (1997) in the catholic church of Christ the King in Backnang and put it on YouTube, where it can still be accessed:

The "Stations of the Cross" (2020) and Selected Organ Works Volume 2, which includes the "Magnificat Versets" (2019), "St. Clare of Assisi" (2019), "Zacchaeus the Tax Collector" (2020), and Variants on Eventide (2021), are now available from the Christoph Dohr Verlag in Cologne.

Concordia Publishing House in St. Louis, Missouri, has accepted Sanders' "Sojourn" for publication. Commissioned by Dr. Sharon L. Hettinger in memory of her late husband, "Sojourn" is comprised of four Chorale Preludes for organ solo encompassing the span of a lifetime: Childhood ("I am Jesus' Little Lamb" / WEIL ICH JESU SCHÄFLEIN BIN), Adulthood ("Thy Way and All Thy Sorrows" / BEFIEHL DU DEINE WEGE), Autumn of Life ("Lord, Take My Hand and Lead Me" / SO NIMM DENN MEINE HÄNDE), and Resurrection ("Awake, My Heart, with Gladness" / AUF, AUF, MEIN HERZ MIT FREUDEN). The collection will be released next year.

Helen van Abbema Rodgers writes: "In October 2023 I retired from St James Episcopal Fairhope, Alabama where I was Music Director for 30 plus years and played the mighty Schlickerama that we purchased from Plymouth Congregational, Lincoln Nebraska in 1997. I am now music director of St Paul's Episcopal in Foley, Al, a much smaller parish. We eagerly await Noack Opus 170 Spring 2025!"



Anders Borjesson hosted the American organist David Furniss in Sweden. He reports:



"During his late summer tour to Ireland, Sweden, and Spain, American organist David Furniss played a concert at the Mariestad Domkyrka in Mariestad, Sweden. His program included a variety of music from several countries, including works by Mexican and American composers. Host organist Anders Börjesson is shown in the photo with Mr. Furniss at the organ console. While in Gothenburg, he had the privilege of playing several different organs, including the relatively new organ at the Gothenburg Concert Hall, as shown in the photo. In addition to attending several organ concerts at the Organ Festival in Granada, Spain, he played in a master class with instructor Pieter Dirksen. Mr. Furniss has returned to his second home in Oaxaca, Mexico, where he occasionally plays concerts on historic pipe organs."

Gabriel Dessauer will attend the National Convention in San Francisco in July / August and give a recital in St Mary's cathedral a few days later.

Judy Riefel-Lindel will rejoin the board, at least for a while. Both our Dean Johan Hermans and Membership Coordinator Ludo Vandersmissen are considerably occupied with the health issues of their wives. Judy will help to keep things on an even keel in this difficult time.

Christa Rakich has 4 chorale preludes recently published by Oxford University Press. They are based on hymn tunes Melita, Faithfulness, Hendon, and O Quanta Qualia (dedicated to fellow chapter member Tom Bailey). They will appear in the series "Oxford Hymn Settings for Organists."

After two years of teaching at the conservatoire in Udine, **Giorgio Parolini** has taken up a new position as Professor at the *Conservatorio* "*Niccolò Paganini*" in Genua. He is glad to be closer to home and excited about the challenges posed by teaching a very young class, many of whom are quite new to the organ! Spring Meeting - last call!

There are still a few days left to run before the deadline for registration for the event of the year! If you haven't registered yet, be sure to do so by the 31st January.

We have circulated all the necessary information a few times now, but would like to reiterate at least some of the most important points.

The city of Leeuwarden in the Province of Friesland, will be our central gathering point for the Spring Meeting. Our designated Spring Meeting Hotel is in the city center of Leeuwarden -- Fletcher Hotel-Palais Stadhouderlijk Hof. We hope you will be pleased to stay in this former 18th century palace of the Dutch royal family, which has retained the allure of a palace while offering its guests recently renovated hotel rooms as well as traditional accommodations, not yet renovated, such as the Royal Suite and Imperial Suite.

Important Hotel reservation information

Each participant will be expected to make his/her own reservation at the hotel for the Spring Meeting, 1-6 April 2024. The hotel staff has shown a friendly, helpful and accommodating attitude toward making our visit as pleasant as possible. The hotel has offered us a group rate for selected rooms that are often reserved for groups for an extended stay. These rooms are located on 3-4 floors in what used to be the "Hofschool" of the palace and were totally renovated four years ago.

Please note that the email address to be used for making bookings has been amended (this was also communicated in an email to the membership some weeks ago). You make also make bookings by telephone. Please do *not* use internet booking engines!

Two types of rooms are being offered with a group discount:

Comfort Double room with private bathroom/shower

Comfort Double room with private bathroom with bathtub/ shower

Price for a Single room (one of the Comfort Double rooms) on the basis of 1 adult per room is 90 Euros per night. Price for a Double room on the basis of 2 adults per room is 100 Euros per night.

These rates include a full buffet breakfast and exclude a tax and handling fee of 3 Euros per per-

son per night.

Also, there is a 3rd category of rooms in the former Hofschool that are not included in the group rate above:

The Double Comfort Deluxe room. This room is what the hotel describes as a large, authentic "attic" room on the 4th floor of the former Hofschool. There is definitely room for another bed to be placed in the room for an additional fee. Four occupants would be allowed to stay in this room. The hotel has said it would also give a discount (smaller than the group discount due to the larger size of the room) to our participants for this type of room. If you are interested in this room you should ask the hotel upon booking what rate they are willing to offer, being sure to mention that you are part of the American Guild of Organists group.

Useful information: There are several elevators in the hotel, so all of the rooms are accessible to everyone. On the ground floor, there are some steps (3-4) now and then in the hallways.

Feel free to communicate any particular needs/wishes

Group rate extension: If you want to reserve more nights before or after our Spring Meeting, 1-6 April, our contact person at the hotel, Laura de Groot (Banquet sales/Fletcher Hotels,) has told us that the group rate may be applied. Also, hotel reservations may cancelled up to one week before the Meeting. Please check on this when you make your reservation.

As several factors influence the cost of attendance at the Spring Meeting, which are largely dependant on the number of participants, we can only communicate this in March.
